

Paolo Soleri: Architect born in Turin, Italy in 1919. Mastermind behind Arcosanti. Lives in Scottsdale, Arizona.












Tree running right through the residence.

The café at Arcosanti, one level down from the gift-shop, with an unforgettable smell. A mix between blue corn, smoked cheese, terra cotta and sandals.




Ceramic Casting Space/Apse






Amphitheater where they host concerts often. Water runs down the levels and through a moat around the stage as a coolant.
